

VERB MOODS

INDICATIVE



Usually using a declarative sentence or statement, the **indicative** mood shows the activity is a fact.

SUBJUNCTIVE



The **subjunctive** mood shows the activity is not a fact (wishes, possibilities, doubts, suggestions, conditions, etc).

IMPERATIVE



The **imperative** mood shows the activity is an urge (command, prohibition, request, advice).

INTERROGATIVE



The **interrogative** mood shows the activity in a state of questioning. It often inverts the order of subjects and verbs.

CONDITIONAL



The **conditional** mood shows the activity is problematic or unreal. It sometimes feels like a cause and effect.

VERB MOODS

INDICATIVE

IMPERATIVE



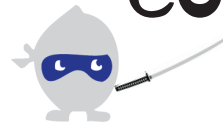
